14 15	WHEREAS, the Court appoints criminal defense attorneys from the "court-appointed list" of private attorneys who sign up to be on the list, provide the representation to the

19	WHEREAS, to maintain their practices, the private attorneys on the court-appointed list often	
20	represent clients throughout western North Carolina and often have to travel to	
21	state courts in multiple counties in a single day to represent their clients; and

23	WHEREAS, this creates scheduling problems for the Cherokee Court, Tribal prosecutors,	
24	defendants and defense counsel and, unfortunately, often results in hearings and	
25	trials being postponed in the Cherokee Court; and

27	WHEREAS, Tribal defendants will be better served, and the Cherokee Court will run more	
28	efficiently, if the Tribe amends the law to authorize the Legal Assistance Office	
29	(LAO) to provide criminal defense services; and

40	NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED, by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of	
41	Cherokee Indians in Council assembled at which a quorum is present, that Tribal	
42	Council hereby amends C.C. § 114A-2 to read as follows:	
43	Sec. 114A-2. Duties.	
44	a. It is the duty of the Legal Assistance Office to:	

45 Provide legal services to the respondent/defendant parties in all C.C. Chapter 7B Child Maltreatment and all C.C. Chapter 122 Involuntary Commitment proceedings: 46 47 ii. Provide civil legal services in domestic violence-related cases: iii. Provide legal services to Tribal members in the Cherokee Court in domestic cases in 48 which the rights and relationships of minor Tribal members may be affected for those 49 who qualify as indigent; 50 iv. Provide drafting services for simple wills, powers of attorney, health care powers of 51 52 attorney, advance directives, and other similar documents; 53 Provide legal services and community education to address the issue of abuse and 54 exploitation of Tribal members; 55 vi. Provide legal self-help and community education resources to enhance Tribal members' understanding of the law and their ability to represent themselves in Court 56 and other administrative and legal proceedings-; 57 58 vii. Provide legal services to indigent criminal defendants charged with crimes in the 59 Cherokee Court. 60 61 BE IT FINALLY ORDAINED, that all resolutions and ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are rescinded, and this ordinance shall become effective upon ratification by the 62 63 Principal Chief. 64 65
