Their programs nurture the greatness in every child, promote well-being through the community, and give back to our neighbors in need. All this work is rooted in their four-core values of caring, honesty, respect, and responsibility and;
16 17 18 19	WHEREAS: Camp Watia is a co-ed overnight camp community committed to these core values and traditional camp programming such as archery, sports, boating, swimming, arts, and crafts as well as specialized enrichment programming that includes STEM curriculum, sustainability education, cultural awareness and environmental studies provided for campers and;
20 21 22	WHEREAS: these activities are proven to build a nurturing foundation where children learn, take risks, and feel a sense of belonging within a supportive setting, while growing to appreciate, honor and care for the precious land where YMCA Camp Watia is located and;
23 24 25	WHEREAS: camp programming focuses on increasing confidence and self-esteem, social skills, and leadership qualities, while decreasing the detrimental effects of summer learning loss and cultivating strong friendships with diverse children from all over Western North Carolina, and;
26 27	WHEREAS: the YMCA Camp Watia seeks to continue their partnership with the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians and:
28 29 30 31 32	WHEREAS: YMCA Camp Watia was established to serve all children in Western North Carolina, and that all children ages seven (7) through seventeen (17) have an opportunity to attend camp if they should desire. With this continued partnership YMCA Camp Watia will assure that a minimum of 25 of all enrolled spots each summer will be prioritized for youth who are members of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.
33 34 35	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Council assembled at which a quorum is present that Tribal Council continue their partnership and financial support_of Camp Watia by donating \$20,000.00 for camp scholarships for the next two years.
