13	WILEDEAS the Footern Band of Charakse Indiana (FBCI) is a federally recognized severity
14 15	WHEREAS, the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI) is a federally recognized, sovereign tribal nation with a unique cultural identity, government, and history rooted in the enduring
16	traditions of the Cherokee people; and
17	traditions of the effective people, and
18	WHEREAS, the position of Ugvwiyuhi (Principal Chief) is a time-honored institution in
19	Cherokee society, reflecting a legacy of servant leadership, vision, and dedication to the well-
20	being of the Cherokee people since time immemorial; and
21	or me one of proper same manufacture, with
22	WHEREAS, EBCI history remembers great leaders such as Yonaguska, Lloyd Welch, Nimrod
23	Jarrett Smith, Sampson Owl, Jarrett Blythe, Osley B. Saunooke, John A. Crowe, Robert
24	Youngdeer, Joyce Dugan, and others, who each served with distinction in guiding the EBCI
25	through eras of struggle, growth, and self-determination; and

27	WHEREAS, the modern office of the Principal Chief continues to be a symbol of Cherokee
28	sovereignty, and each Principal Chief is entrusted with the responsibility to uphold the values of
29	the Cherokee people, protect tribal resources, and advance the collective future of the Nation;

32	WHEREAS, President's Day is a federal holiday that honors the presidents of the United States
33	but does not reflect the distinct leadership traditions, cultural identity, or sovereign governance
34	of the EBCI; and
35	
36	WHEREAS, the EBCI desires to reaffirm its self-governance and celebrate its own leaders
37	through the creation of "Principal Chief's Day," also to be known in the Cherokee language as
38	"Ugvwiyuhi Iga", to be observed in place of President's Day each year; and
39	WITEDEAS this he lider will provide an approximity for the Charakse community to a Sect
40	WHEREAS, this holiday will provide an opportunity for the Cherokee community to reflect upon the achievements, legacy, and responsibilities of Cherokee leadership, and to instill in
41	future generations a deeper appreciation for the history and resilience of their Nation;

44	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, in
45	Council assembled at which a quorum is present, that:

"Principal Chief's Day" is hereby established as an official tribal holiday of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.

This holiday shall be observed annually on the third Monday in February and shall replace the observance of President's Day for all tribal government offices and employees.

Tribal programs, agencies, and schools are encouraged to honor this day through educational activities, cultural programming, and events that promote understanding of Cherokee leadership, governance, and historical continuity.

Appropriate action is taken to revise the official tribal holiday calendar to reflect this change and ensure all departments and employees are notified accordingly.

The EBCI Communications Department are encouraged to develop and share content that highlights the lives and legacies of past Principal Chiefs as part of the annual observance.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that that all resolutions inconsistent with this resolution are rescinded, and this resolution shall become effective immediately upon ratification by the Principal Chief.
