WHEREAS, The Tribe's Medical Institutional Review Board (IRB) has been assigned the task of reviewing health-related research requests made to the Eastern Band, AND

WHEREAS, The Medical IRB has reviewed and approved a research request made by Dr. Lisa Bloom, Western Carolina University, to conduct a research study with the Protocol Title: "Best practice in classroom management: Promoting social and emotional skills in the classroom," AND

WHEREAS, Gaining an understanding of how good teachers promote social and emotional well-being and use positive classroom management practices can add to the knowledge about how to assist teacher candidates, novice teachers and teachers who struggle with promoting social and emotional well-being and classroom management, AND

WHEREAS, The purpose of this study is to observe the practices by excellent teachers that promote positive outcomes for K-12 learners in social and emotional well-being and self-regulation in area schools including Cherokee Central Schools, AND

WHEREAS, This study may provide indirect benefits to the students and teachers in Cherokee Central Schools, AND

WHEREAS, The Secretary of the Public Health and Human Services Division (PHHS) has reviewed the request and the IRB's recommendations and has also given approval, AND

WHEREAS, The researcher acknowledges that all information obtained from this research is the property of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians and will be forwarded to the EBCI Secretary of PHHS for review and Dr. Bloom will not use this information in any manner not authorized,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, in Council assembled, at which a quorum is present, that Dr. Lisa Bloom, Western Carolina University, is hereby granted permission to carry-out the above-named research project as described in her IRB proposal, carrying out all follow-up and reporting as required by the Tribal Medical IRB.
