WHEREAS Fred Bruner Lunsford, born March 7, 1925, to the late Inez Rogers and Pearlie M. Lunsford; passed to his Heavenly Home on March 1, 2025. Fred graduated from Andrews High School in the spring of 1943 and he and Gladys Greene Lunsford were married March 17, 1944, following Fred's induction and basic training in the US Army, during World War II, and,

WHEREAS He began his journey in the Christian faith with a profession of faith at age 12. Upon entering the US Army in 1943, he took his unwavering faith with him as he served in the 839th Ordinance Depot Company 3rd Army Division. While serving he was in the Normandy Invasion, the Battle of the Bulge and the Liberation of France. For his valor, he received numerous commendations, reflecting his dedication and courage. Upon returning from WW II, he was ordained as a deacon by his home church, Vengeance Creek Baptist Church, and,
