13		to and from Cherokee, North Carolina, the Great Smoky Mountains National Park
14		(hereinafter, the "Park"), Gatlinburg, and Sevierville, Tennessee; and

17		provide substantial annual revenues, and when the road is closed, revenues are

20	WHEREAS,	the Park has become very aggressive about closing the road when Park personnel
21		make an internal decision, without consultation with officials in Cherokee, that the
22		safety of travelers Highway 441 may be compromised due to bad weather; and

28	WHEREAS,	on November 4, 2024, the National Park Service issued Director's Order #71C,
29	WILLIAM,	which requires the Park Service to consult with Indian tribes regarding Park Service
30		decisions that "may have a substantial direct effect on an Indian Tribe" on various
31		matters, and the EBCI believes use and control of Highway 441 are two of those
32		matters; and
33		
34	WHEREAS,	the Park Service and the Park are not consulting with the EBCI in any meaningful
35	,	way about closures of Highway 441; and
36		
37	WHEREAS,	this resolution authorizes the EBCI to conduct a study of all relevant aspects of
38	HM2 \$44.50 Chestable into a said basic con-	Highway 441, with the goal of determining how management and control of the
39		road, and consultation about the road, may be improved.
40		
41	NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee	
42		Indians, in Council assembled, at which a quorum is present, that the Tribe is
43		authorized to fund and conduct a study of Highway 441 as it serves Cherokee and
44		partner communities that will assess and evaluate the following issues:
45		
46		(a) The legal status of Highway 441 on Tribal trust land in Cherokee;

2	impose a fac for such use:
3	impose a fee for such use;
4	(c) The Tribe's relationships with other government entities that impacts some aspects of Highway 441;
5	(d) Measuring traffic on the road for all seasons and traffic created from loca
6	events;
7	(e) Assessing relationships with private businesses and local governments that
8	share the Tribe's concern about the road;
9	(f) Any other matter relevant to Highway 441 and its management and control; and
10	(g) Options for the residents of the Tow String community, and other local
11	community members, to ease access, including Saunooke Bridge Road.
12	
13	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the cost for the analysis shall not exceed \$ and
14	will be taken from the FY 25 General Fund Reserve.
15	
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the timeline to perform the analysis will be no longer than
17	120 days from the date of ratification of this resolution in which the final
18	assessment will be provided to Tribal Council once concluded.
19	
20	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that all resolutions that are inconsistent with this resolution are
21	rescinded, and that this resolution shall become effective when ratified by the
22	Principal Chief.
