(2025) 12 13 A resolution to authorize and request the development of a single EBCI database of information and cases 14 concerning Missing and Murdered Indigenous People (MMIP). 15 WHEREAS, the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI) is a sovereign tribal nation dedicated to the protection, safety, and well-being of its tribal members; and 16 17 WHEREAS, indigenous communities, including the EBCI, have been disproportionately affected by the crisis of Missing and Murdered Indigenous People (MMIP), with 18 many cases going unreported, uninvestigated, or unresolved due to jurisdictional 19 20 barriers and gaps in data collection; and 21 WHEREAS, the absence of an official MMIP database for the EBCI has led to fragmented. 22 inconsistent, and incomplete records, making it difficult for families, law 23 enforcement, and advocacy organizations to get accurate and up-to-date 24 information; and 25 WHEREAS, relying on multiple, uncoordinated data sources, as we do now, creates confusion. 26 delays responses, and hinders investigative efforts; and 27 WHEREAS, a single, official MMIP database that consolidates all relevant information in one 28 secure and reliable platform will serve as the centralized source for tracking missing and murdered individuals, and will improve case management, response 29 30 efforts, and accountability; and 31 WHEREAS, by creating and managing the database, the EBCI can ensure that measures are in place to protect tribal sovereignty, cultural sensitivity, privacy expectations, and 32 33 law enforcement protocols; and 34 WHEREAS, the EBCI desires to make the development of an MMIP database a collaborative 35 effort by and between the Office of the Principal Chief, the Office of Information 36 Technology, the Cherokee Indian Police Department, and other key stakeholders. 37 NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of 38 Cherokee Indians, in Council assembled, and with a quorum present, that the 39 Tribe will establish a single, official Missing and Murdered Indigenous People (MMIP) database, to: 40

1 2		1. Consolidate MMIP case data into a single database to ensure consistency, accuracy, and accessibility.
3 4		2. Provide law enforcement, emergency services, and legal authorities with a centralized system for case tracking and coordination.
5 6	,	3. Offer a clear, centralized resource for families seeking updates, assistance, and advocacy.
7 8	ન)	4. Improve data collection, reporting, and transparency to drive policy changes and resource allocation.
9 10		5. Prevent MMIP cases from being lost or forgotten, by maintaining accurate and updated records in a single platform.
11 12 13 14 15	BE IT FURT	CHER RESOLVED, that the Office of the Principal Chief, with assistance from the Office of Information Technology, the Cherokee Indian Police Department, and other key stakeholders, are authorized and requested to develop, implement, and maintain the EBCI MMIP database, and shall do so in a manner that protects tribal sovereignty, complies with legal standards, and follows best practices in data management.
