WHEREAS, we lost our communication with "Brother Bear" and now we are losing our connection with other brothers and sisters, and,

WHEREAS, we are supposed to protect our animal council not throw them out, forget them or mistreat them, and,

WHEREAS, as an advocate for those not able to speak for themselves, I am choosing to stand up for what is neglected and lost, to have a no kill, non-profit animal sanctuary is and could be our chance to regain our connection our council, and,

WHEREAS, it's time to protect what we once did again, I have had to witness injured animals not being helped because they are on the Boundary and being stained by those that have let them down, it's time to stand up

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Council assembled at which a quorum is present that Tribal Council hereby approves a feasibility study be conducted to explore the cost and placement of an no kill and non-profit animal sanctuary

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this resolution shall become effective upon ratification of the Principal Chief
