8	An ordinance to prohibit begging, panhandling or soliciting contributions.
10	WHEREAS, Tribal Council is authorized and empowered to adopt laws and regulations for the
11	general government of the Tribe, to govern the management of real and personal
12	property held by the Tribe, and is vested with full power to enforce obedience to
13 14	such laws and regulations as may be enacted by the Tribe (EBCI Charter and Governing Document § 23); and
15	Governing Document § 25), and
16	WHEREAS, in the last several years, an increasing number of Tribal citizens have been
17	approached or accosted, sometimes aggressively, by persons who are begging,
18	panhandling or soliciting financial contributions in a public places in manner that
19 20	threatens the safety and security of the citizens or of the person doing the begging, panhandling or soliciting; and
21	paintailuting of soficiting, and
22	WHEREAS, Cherokee Code Chapter 14 should be amended by adding a new section to prohibit
23	begging, panhandling or soliciting in certain situations.
24	NOW THEREFORE DE IT ORDANIED I ALL FOR DOLL AGE ALL THE ACTUAL TO THE
25 26 27	NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Tribal Council assembled, at which a quorum is present, that Cherokee Code Chapter 14 shall be amended by adding a new § 14-25.21, to read as follows:
28 29	Sec. 14-25.21. Begging, panhandling, or soliciting contributions.
30 31	(a) Definitions:
32	(1) To beg, panhandle, or solicit contributions shall be defined to include, without
33 34	limitation, the spoken, written, or printed word or such other acts as are conducted in furtherance of the purpose of obtaining contributions;
35	(2) Accosting another person shall be defined as approaching or speaking to someone in
36	such a manner as would cause a reasonable person to fear imminent bodily harm or the
37	commission of a criminal act or damage to property in his immediate possession;
38 39 40	(3) Intimidate another person shall be defined as acting in such a way as would cause a reasonable person to fear bodily harm and therefore to do something he or she would not otherwise have done;
41	(4) Forcing oneself upon the company of another person shall be defined as:

43 44 45	<ul> <li>(i) Continuing to request or solicit contributions in close proximity to the person addressed after that person has responded negatively;</li> </ul>

2	(ii) blocking the passage of the person addressed, of
3 4 5	(iii)Otherwise engaging in conduct which reasonably could be understood as intended to force a person to accede to demands.
6 7	(5) Public place shall be defined to include streets, highways, and roadways (including the shoulders and medians), sidewalks and other areas held open to the public.
8 9 10 11	(6) Vocal appeal shall be defined as begging, panhandling, or solicitation of contributions by spoken word or other verbal request. This shall not include the act of performing live music or chiefing pursuant to a permit for such activities issued under C.C. § 105- 17.
12 13 14	(7) Direct written appeal shall be defined as begging, panhandling, or solicitation by handing to a person or attempting to hand to a person a written solicitation for immediate contributions.
15	(8) Nighttime shall be defined as the time from sunset to sunrise.
16 17 18	(b) No person shall beg, panhandle, or solicit contributions in a public place in a manner so as to intimidate another person or by accosting another person, or by forcing oneself upon the company of another person.
19 20 21	(c) No person shall beg, panhandle, or solicit contributions from another person within twenty (20) feet of an entrance or exit of any bank or financial institution or within twenty (20) feet of any automated teller machine.
22 23 24 25	(d) No person shall beg, panhandle, or solicit contributions in any public transportation vehicle owned or operated by the Tribe or at any Tribal transit stop location for such vehicle or within twenty (20) feet of a Tribal transit stop location, or Tribal transit stop sign, Tribal transit stop shelter, or Tribal transit stop bench.
26 27	(e) No person shall beg, panhandle, or solicit contributions while sitting or standing on a roadway or the shoulder or median of a roadway.
28 29 30 31	(f) No person shall beg, panhandle, or solicit contributions on property that is part of an individual's possessory holding of Tribal trust land or on such property that is subject to a commercial lease or use permit, unless the person has written permission from the possessory holder, lessor, or permittee.
32 33	(g) No person shall beg, panhandle, or solicit contributions in a public place by vocal appeal or direct written appeal during nighttime.
34 35	(h) Violation of this section shall constitute a misdemeanor and shall subject the violator to a fine of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment for not more than five (5) days.
36 37 38 39 40	BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that all resolutions that are inconsistent with this resolution are rescinded, and that this resolution shall become effective when ratified by the Principal Chief.
