- WHEREAS, Cherokee Code (C.C.) Section 117-50(b) states that "Any legislation presented at the state or federal level must be approved through a resolution of Tribal Council."
- WHEREAS, with the assistance of the Tribe's lobbyist, John Metcalf and the Policy Group, Inc., the Tribe has several legislative measures "on the table" at the North Carolina General Assembly; and
- WHEREAS, most of the legislative measures have already been approved by Tribal Council; and
- WHEREAS, Tribal Council's approval is requested again, for the sake of clarity and express compliance with C.C. Sec. 117-50(b), by approval of this resolution.
- NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians assembled, at which a quorum is present, in compliance with C.C. Sec. 117-50, hereby approves the pursuit of the following legislation (expressed here by subject area) at the North Carolina General Assembly.
 - (a) Legislation to exempt enrolled members of the EBCI from the requirement to pay state-imposed hunting and fishing license fees for hunting and fishing on non-Tribal land.
 - (b) Legislation to allow teachers of the Cherokee language to apply for and obtain a North Carolina teacher's certification as foreign language teachers and exempting them from the requirement that they have a college degree.
 - (c) Legislation establishing an EBCI Tribal license plate to be issued by the state and which would be issued only to enrolled members of the EBCI upon proof of enrollment.
 - (d) Legislation renaming Highway 74, sometimes called the Andrew Jackson Highway, as the Trail of Tears Memorial Highway.
 - (e) Legislation opposing the general legalization of sweepstakes betting in North Carolina.

- (f) Legislation opposing the general legalization of fantasy sports betting in North Carolina.
- (g) Legislation to protect, preserve and improve access to, and benefits from, the the Medicaid program administered by North Carolina.
- E IT FINALLY RESOLVED that all resolutions that are inconsistent with this resolution are rescinded, and that this resolution shall become effective when ratified by the Principal Chief.
