NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in council assembled where a quorum is present that the Dora Reed Children's Center, Big Cove Children's Center and QBHS/EHS program of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians Public Health and Human Services Division (PHHS) is authorized to receive these funds from the North Carolina Department of Health and Human Services up to \$262,000 for FY19, and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Principal Chief is authorized to carry out the intent of this resolution, which shall remain in effect until implemented or rescinded.
