WHEREAS, the Tribe's Cultural Institutional Review Board (CIRB) has been assigned the task of reviewing research requests made to the Eastern Band, and;

WHEREAS, the CIRB has reviewed and approved a research request made by Laurel Sanders, in fulfillment of a Ph.D. in History at the University of Iowa, to conduct a study entitled "Public Health Nursing in Native American Communities, 1924-1955", and;

WHEREAS, the purpose of this study is to examine the work of public health nurses in the early and midtwentieth century in order to understand Native communities' expressions of self-determination in interactions with government healthcare providers on the Qualla Boundary and;

WHEREAS, Mrs. Sanders seeks to conduct oral history interviews with EBCI Tribal Members focusing on the career of Lula Owl Gloyne, and working with tribal members to review archive materials to provide an indigenous perspective on the local history of public health, and;

WHEREAS, the researcher acknowledges that all information obtained from the research is the property of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians and will be forwarded to the EBCI Cultural Resources Supervisor for review. Mrs. Sanders and the University of Iowa will not use this information in any manner not authorized.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Council assembled at which a quorum is present that Laurel Sanders is hereby granted permission to carry-out the above named research project as described in her CIRB proposal, carrying out all follow-up and reporting as required by Tribal CIRB

BE IT FINALLY RESOVLED that the EBCI Cultural Resources shall carry out the intent of this resolution and that this resolution become effective upon ratification by the Principal Chief.
