1 Cherokee Council House 2 Cherokee, North Carolina 3 SEP 06 2018 4 5 Date 6 7 8 ORDINANCE NO. 333 (2018) 9 10 11 WHEREAS, the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI) continues to strive for a healthy, safe 12 13 and prosperous population through community partnership and tribal government 14 services; and 15 16 WHEREAS, historically many government services were previously implemented under the direction and policy goals of the state or federal government; and 17 18 19 WHEREAS, now many of the same government services are provided under the direction and policy goals of the Tribe and therefore the Tribe is responsible for ensuring that 20 21 services are effective and targeted for the specific outcomes necessary for meeting 22 community wide goals of safety, health, education, cultural enrichment and :3 prosperity for all tribal members within our population; and ;4 25 WHEREAS. an evidence-based methodology for achieving measurable advancement of these community wide goals is needed for focused data driven internal reviews, regular 26 reporting of outcomes of government programs and budgeting decisions based on 27 areas of priority and effective services that are proven to achieve the results that 28 lend to our population's right to be safe, healthy, educated, culturally enriched and 29 30 prosperous. 31 32 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians assembled, at which a quorum is present that the Eastern Band of Cherokee 33 34 Indians does hereby amend the Cherokee Code as follows: 35 36 37 Chapter 117B – Results-Based Accountability 38 39 Article I. - PURPOSE 40 41 Sec. 117B-1. - Population-Level Outcomes. 42 It is necessary for the tribal government to use data to monitor five basic community or 43 44 population results that Tribal Council through its policy making, funding and community partnerships seeks to achieve for the tribal population. The five population goals shall be 45 regularly monitored and include population safety, health, education, cultural enrichment and

prosperity. Data informed reviews of how well the tribal population is doing as it concerns these

foundational population-level outcomes will assist the Tribal Council in determining how best to prioritize and invest tribal dollars.

Sec. 117B-2. - Budgets.

Tribal Council will evaluate the effectiveness of tribally funded strategies that lend to the achievement of the five population results for the tribal community. Indicators for the population goals will be used to inform and help focus budget priorities for the Tribal Council. Monitoring indicators of the population goals will help Tribal Council and the community be more strategic, and responsive to meeting immediate needs, while focusing on the long term and achieving the population results.

Sec. 117B-3. - Data-Based Information.

Using the data-based information provided in this law will encourage tribal government to continue to move steadily toward results-based accountability and will help educate the tribal population on the areas that indicate how well the community is rating in terms of population safety, health, education, cultural enrichment and prosperity. Outcome or results-based government accountability as a methodology for monitoring and tracking population indicators influenced by government program performance measures shall be incorporated into all reporting, review and decisions made by the Tribal Council, the Executive Branch and the Judicial Branch.

Article II. - ANNUAL REPORT ON POPULATION-LEVEL OUTCOMES USING INDICATORS

Sec. 117B-4. - Report.

Annually, on or before July 30, the Secretaries within the Executive Branch and the Chief Justice of the Judicial Branch shall report to the Tribal Council on the Tribe's progress in reaching program or agency goals for performance and the Tribal Council shall inform the public about the community's progress in achieving the population-level results that are essential for each Cherokee member's quality of life.

Sec. 117B-5. Coordinated Multi-System Population-Level Indicators and Program Level Performance Measures.

The Tribal Council will collaborate with the Cherokee Indian Hospital Authority, the Cherokee Central School system, the Executive Branch and the Judicial Branch every five years beginning October 1, 2019 to identify specific population-level indicators for each of the five basic population results essential for a thriving community. These indicators will assist in prioritizing and budgeting for program level strategies and services for which the performance of these strategies and services shall be regularly monitored by each service provider program or entity on a quarterly basis.
