WHEREAS,	the therapeutic pools can service a variety of illnesses and help increase flexibility and strengthen muscles, can alleviate the symptoms of many medical conditions, decrease joint swelling and reduce pain and,
WHEREAS,	therapeutic pools can help people who have breathing disorders, high blood pressure, cardiac rehabilitation, chronic back pain, muscle or joint pain, diabetes, fibromyalgia, lupus, nerve disorders, arthritis, stress reduction and weight management just to name a few and,
WHEREAS,	the services of a therapeutic pool could help a lot of people in our community and would help a lot of people who are living with many of the situations mentioned above and,
WHEREAS,	the pool that is housed in the Cherokee Life Center is not very dependable and has to close from time to time for maintenance, etc. and there is not a pool close to us that would be a convenient transport for some of the people who do use the pool for these reasons mentioned above
NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Council assembled at which a quorum is present that Tribal Council instruct the Tribal Planning Department, and other programs as required to begin a feasibility study on the construction of two therapeutic pools to be built and added on to the Cherokee Life Center to offer the services to any enrolled member who has the medical need for the use of a therapeutic pool	
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this study shall be complete within days and that if the results of the feasibility study prove that it will be a good fit that the necessary steps be taken to begin the work required to get this project started	
BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that this resolution shall become effective upon ratification by the Principal Chief and that the Planning Department shall carry out the intent of this resolution
