1 CHEROKEE COUNCIL HOUSE 2 CHEROKEE, NORTH CAROLINA 3 Date: MAR 1 4 2019 4 5 ORDINANCE NO. 5 (2019) 6 7 8 WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 408 (2018), which amended the Tribe's election law, deleted 9 Cherokee Code (C.C.) § 161-8, which addressed filling vacancies in elected 10 office; and 11 12 WHEREAS, Sec. 161-8 was deleted to remove redundancies and simplify Tribal law by 13 combining the provisions of that section with existing Code sections governing 14 succession in elected offices, including C.C. § 117-7 (Vacancies in Chief Offices) 15 and C.C.§ 115-9 (Vacancies in School Board); and 16 17 vacancies in Chief Offices and in Tribal Council are also addressed in Sec. 14 and WHEREAS, 18 Sec. 15 of the Tribal Charter and Governing Document, but those sections are 19 short on necessary detail; and 20 21 WHEREAS, this amends existing the Code to provide an orderly mechanism for succession in 22 certain elected offices when a vacancy occurs. 23 24 NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Tribal 25 Council assembled, at which a quorum is present, that C.C. § 117-7 shall be 26 amended as provided below, that a new section identified as C.C. § 117-11.1 shall 27 be added to the Code, and that C.C. § 115-9 shall be amended to read as follows: 28 29 Sec. 117-7. - Succession upon v-Vacancy in Chief offices. 30 31 The provisions of this section shall be construed consistently with, and to give effect to, (a) 32 Sec. 14 of the Tribal Charter and Governing Document. In the event of the death, resignation or disability of the Principal Chief, the Vice Chief shall become Principal 33 34 Chief and shall serve the balance of the elected term of office until removal or disability 35 or his successor is elected. In case of death, resignation or disability of the Vice-Chief, 36 the Council may elect a successor who shall serve until removal or disability or his 37 successor is elected. In the event the offices of both Principal Chief and Vice-Chief 38 become vacant simultaneously, the Chairman of the Council shall become Principal Chief 39 and shall serve the balance of the elected term of office, and the Council shall elect a Vice-Chief, who shall serve the balance of the elected term. If the Chairman does not 40 41 meet the qualifications for the office of Principal Chief, the vacancy shall be filled by an 42 election under rules established by the Council. 43 44 Vacancy in the Office of Principal Chief. If the office of Principal Chief becomes vacant, 45 the Vice Chief shall become the Principal Chief upon being sworn-in by the Chief Justice of the Cherokee Supreme Court or his/her designee. The newly sworn-in Principal Chief 46

shall serve the balance of the Principal Chief's elected term of office. No special election shall be held.

(c) Vacancy in the Office of Vice Chief. If the office of Vice Chief becomes vacant, the Tribal Council shall elect a successor from the then-current Tribal Council representatives no later than the next regularly scheduled Tribal Council session after the vacancy occurs. The Tribal Council representative elected to fill the vacancy shall become the Vice Chief upon being sworn into the office of Vice Chief by the Chief Justice of the Cherokee Supreme Court or his/her designee. The newly sworn-in Vice Chief shall serve the balance of the Vice Chief's elected term of office. No special election shall be held unless none of the then-sitting Tribal Council representatives are qualified to hold the office of Vice Chief.

Simultaneous Vacancy in the Office of Principal Chief and Office of Vice Chief -Chairman of Tribal Council Qualified. If the office of the Principal Chief and the office of the Vice Chief become vacant simultaneously, the Chairman of the Tribal Council, if qualified, shall become Principal Chief upon being sworn into the vacant position by the Chief Justice of the Cherokee Supreme Court or his/her designee. The newly sworn-in Principal Chief shall serve the balance of the Principal Chief's elected term of office. Additionally, the Tribal Council shall elect a Vice Chief from among the then-serving Tribal Council representatives qualified to serve as Vice-Chief, and such Tribal Council election shall be held at the first regularly scheduled Tribal Council session immediately following the occurrence of the vacancy. The newly elected Vice Chief shall be sworn-in by the Chief Justice of the Cherokee Supreme Court or his/her designee. The newly swornin Vice Chief shall serve the balance of the Vice Chief's elected term of office. No special election shall be held unless none of the then-sitting Tribal Council representatives are qualified to hold the office of Principal Chief and Vice Chief as provided herein. If a special election is held, the candidate winning the special election shall serve the remaining time left in the term of office.

 (e) Simultaneous Vacancy in the Office of Principal Chief and Office of Vice Chief - Chairman of Tribal Council Not Qualified. If the office of the Principal Chief and Vice Chief become vacant simultaneously and the Chairman of Tribal Council is not qualified to fill the vacancy in the office of Principal Chief, the vacancy shall be filled as provided in this subsection. The Tribal Council representative elected by Council to fill the vacant office of Vice Chief shall temporarily serve as "Acting" Principal Chief until the Board of Elections conducts a special election of all registered and eligible voters within sixty (60) days of the vacancy, pursuant to rules adopted by the Board. The candidate receiving the greatest number of votes shall be deemed elected to the office of Principal Chief. Once the Principal Chief is elected and swornin by the Chief Justice of the Cherokee Supreme Court or his/her designee, the "Acting" Principal Chief shall step down and resume the duties of the office of Vice Chief to which he or she was previously elected by Tribal Council.

(f) Simultaneous Vacancy in the Office of Principal Chief and Office of Vice Chief - No Qualified Tribal Council Members. If the offices of the Principal Chief and Vice Chief become vacant simultaneously and none of the then-sitting Tribal Council representatives are qualified to fill the vacant positions, the Board of Elections shall hold a special election of all registered and

- eligible voters to fill both vacancies. In such a situation, the Chairman of the Tribal Council
 shall serve as "Acting Chief" until the Principal Chief and Vice Chief are elected and sworn
 in to office as provided in subsection (d).
 - (g) Authority of "Acting" Principal Chief. Any person serving as "Acting" Principal Chief as provided in subsection (e) or (f) of this section during the short interval until a special election is held, shall have limited authority while he or she is the Acting Principal Chief. His or her authority shall be limited to performing administrative duties, which shall preclude changes to the organizational chart of the Tribal government and other large-scale changes.

Sec. 117-11.1. Succession upon vacancy in Tribal Council.

- (a) The provisions of this section shall be construed consistently with, and to give effect to, Sec. 15 of the Tribal Charter and Governing Document.
- (b) In the event of a vacancy on Tribal Council that has more than six months remaining in the elected term applicable to that Council seat, the Board of Elections shall conduct, pursuant to rules adopted by the Board, a special election of registered voters in that township within forty-five (45) days of the date the Tribal Council seat became vacant. The candidate receiving the greatest number of votes cast in the special election shall be deemed elected to the vacant Tribal Council seat. If there are six (6) months or less remaining in the term of the vacated Tribal Council seat, no special election shall be held and the Tribal Council seat shall remain vacant until the next regular election.

Sec. 115-9. - - Succession upon v Vacancy in School Board.

If a vacancy occurs within the School Board due to death, resignation or removal, the Tribal Council shall call a special election within 30 calendar days of the vacancy, and a new board member shall be elected in the community in which the vacancy occurs. However, if less than 90 days remains in the original term on the date of vacancy, the seat shall remain vacant until the next regular election.

In the event of a vacancy in one of the seats for School Board, if that seat has more than six (6) months remaining in the elected term of office, the Board of Elections shall conduct a special election, pursuant to rules adopted by the Board, within forty-five (45) days of such vacancy. The candidate receiving the highest number of votes in the special election for the vacant School Board seat shall be deemed elected to the vacant seat. If there are six (6) months or less remaining in the term of the vacated seat, the seat shall remain vacant until the next regular election.

BE IT FINALLY ORDAINED that all ordinances that are inconsistent with this ordinance are rescinded, and that this ordinance shall become effective when ratified by the Principal Chief.
