ORDINANCE NO. 621 (2019)

WHEREAS, the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians (EBCI) has committed to a data-informed methodology to achieve the goals of Safety, Health, Education, Cultural Enrichment and Prosperity for our Tribe;

WHEREAS, Ordinance 333 (2018) sets the framework for how the Tribe will begin to measure and monitor population indicators to inform the community about the status of aspects of population wellbeing; and

WHEREAS, in order to succeed in this long-range endeavor, the Tribe must be able to identify where accountability and responsibility will reside acknowledging that managing a multi-system collaboration for the achievement of long-range population level goals will require specialized skills and resources dedicated to this single endeavor.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians assembled, at which a quorum is present that the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians does hereby amend the Cherokee Code as follows:

## **Chapter 117B – Results-Based Accountability**

### **Article I. PURPOSE**

### **Article II. ANNUAL REPORT ON POPULATION-LEVEL OUTCOMES USING INDICATORS**

### **Article III. ADMINISTRATION OF MULTI-SYSTEM COLLABORATION**

#### **Sec. 117B-11.- Chief Data Manager of the Multisystem Collaborative is Authorized.**

The Principal Chief shall establish within a dedicated existing Division a Chief Data Manager that will have the authority and responsibility to collect and review performance and outcome data from any and all tribal entities that the Chief Data Manager coordinates

1 to manage progress towards collective impact focused on the priority population indicators  
2 that Tribal Council establishes periodically. The Chief Data Manger shall prepare  
3 annually the data informing the status of these population indicators for review by the  
4 Tribal Council.

6 Sec. 117B-12.- Multi-System Collaboration; Data-Informed Management  
7

8 There shall be quarterly meetings for the multi-system collaborative where the  
9 Chief Data Manager shall prepare and facilitate the agenda to include at a minimum  
10 review of performance data for strategies identified as essential contributors for improving  
11 the status of priority population indicators.

12 Each quarterly meeting shall be attended by the Principal Chief and the Secretaries  
13 of the Divisions within the Executive Branch; the Chief Justice of the Judicial Branch; the  
14 Superintendent of the Cherokee Central School System; the Chief Executive Officer of the  
15 Cherokee Indian Hospital; and any other heads of tribal entities that in the judgment of  
16 Chief Data Manager is essential to the collective data and impact for the population  
17 indicators that the Tribe has identified for regular monitoring.

18 The Chief Data Manager shall be responsible for providing assistance to entities and  
19 programs in need of an increased level of education and capacity building for the collection  
20 of performance and outcome data.

21 The Chief Data Manager shall be the liaison between Tribal Council and the multi-  
22 system collaborative and shall assist with ensuring that Chapter 117B is administered for  
23 the benefit of the tribal community.

26 BE IT FINALLY ORDAINED that this ordinance shall be effective upon ratification by the

1 Principal Chief and any prior or part thereof that conflicts with this ordinance is rescinded.
