RESOLUTION NO. LOLOH (2019)

- WHEREAS, Jill Cherie Lossiah is the holder of the possessory interest in Upper Cherokee Community Parcel No. 139-N and needs a right-of-way to her possessory holding so she may build a home as well as to avoid being landlocked; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed right-of-way would be a newly constructed road coming off of Grassy Branch Road through Upper Cherokee Community Parcel No. 199-B, held by Stanley Harold Ross, and Upper Cherokee Community Parcel No. 139-J, held by William Lawson Smith; and
- WHEREAS, the proposed road would avoid any potential buildable house sites; and
- WHEREAS, other potential routes have been explored and this is the most viable option in order to carry materials to Ms. Lossiah's possessory holding to build a home; and
- WHEREAS, Mr. Smith has expressed a willingness to grant a right-of-way to Ms. Lossiah, but Mr. Ross has not been easy to contact nor expressed a willingness to grant a right-of-way after attempts have been made to contact him.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Council Assembled, at which a quorum is present, that the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians does hereby grant and convey to Jill Cherie Lossiah a road right-of-way to her possessory holding, Upper Cherokee Community Parcel No. 139-N, via a route to be constructed coming off of Grassy Branch Road and passing through Upper Cherokee Community Parcel Nos. 199-B and 139-J without the signatures of William Lawson Smith and Stanley Harold Ross.
- **BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED**, that the new constructed road to be used as a road right-of-way for Jill Cherie Lossiah shall avoid any potentially buildable house sites where feasible.
