WHEREAS; PHHS-Administration program has identified a funding source with Dogwood Health Trust, which provides one-time support for immediate needs or opportunities through the ION grant (Immediate Opportunities and Needs), Dogwood Health Trust is committed to improving well-being for all the people in Western North Carolina, focusing on diversity, equity, and inclusion; and

WHEREAS; the PHHS-Administration program has a website that offers valuable information to our enrolled members, information about PHHS programs such as hours of operation, important phone numbers, locations, and requirements for service, at this time the website itself is outdated and the website developers are going out of business, rendering us unable to update the site, through funding from the Dogwood Health Trust, PHHS will be able to update the website completely and to better serve our people; and

WHEREAS; the grant budget does not allow for salaries; and

WHEREAS; there is no grant match required; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Tribal Council of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians in Council assembled where a quorum is present that the Administration program of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians Public Health and Human Services Division be authorized to apply and accept funds from the Dogwood Health Trust in the amount of \$25,000 for FY20.

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED that the Principal Chief is authorized to carry out the intent of the resolution, which shall remain in effect until implemented or rescinded.
