33		Chapter 120 - CHEROKEE POLICE COMMISSION

The purpose of <a href="mailto:the-commission">the Commission</a> this chapter is to <a href="mailto:create an independent commission whose mission is to-provide\_performance and">create and regulatory oversight to all of Tribal law enforcement agencies and to act as the liaison between the community, law enforcement, and the Executive and Legislative branches of Tribal Government\_providing transparency and advocacy to issues influencing crime and justice on Tribal trust lands.

## Sec. 120-3. - Definitions.

- The following words, terms and phrases as used in this chapter, shall be defined as follows:
- (a) Commission shall mean the Cherokee Police Commission (CPC).
  - (b) Commissioner and/or member shall mean an authorized member of the Cherokee Police Commission.
    - (c) Chairman shall mean the Chairperson of the Cherokee Police Commission.
    - (d) Vice Chairman shall mean the Vice-Chairperson of the Cherokee Police Commission.
    - (e) Law Enforcement shall mean an agency responsible for enforcing the laws of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, including but not limited to: the Cherokee Police Department (CPD), the Alcohol Law Enforcement (ALE), the Natural Resources Enforcement Office (NREO) and Cherokee Animal Control (CAC), Marshal Service/Probation, and Detention Center.
    - (f) Law Enforcement Officer or Law Enforcement Official shall mean any authorized personnel delegated authority to enforce the laws of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians.

## Sec. 120-4. - Commission membership.

Nominations to serve on the Cherokee Police Commission are made by the Principal Chief. Tribal Council approves membership appointments and the Commission's annual work plan. The Commission shall consist of eight members, six of whom shall be members representing the six Tribal townships of the Eastern Band of Cherokee Indians, the other two representing one "at large" male and one "at large" female. Commissioners may be removed from office by the nominating authority for just cause, as recommended by a majority vote of the Police Commissioners. The Cherokee Police Commission may recommend to Tribal Council that a member of the Commission be removed therefrom if a majority of the members of the Commission agree. Commissioners shall be removed from office by the nominating authority.

## Sec. 120-5. - Authority.

- The Cherokee Police Commission is hereby vested with the following authority:
- (a) Oversight of all Tribal Law Enforcement programs. The Chief of Police and other Tribal Law Enforcement Managers shall manage the daily operations of their respective program and shall implement the Commission's policies and goals; the Chief of Police and other Tribal Law Enforcement Managers shall report to the Commission.

- (b) Review, amend and approve as needed Enact the overallagency policy and procedure manuals, handbooks, or guidelines or memorandums of understanding policy, rules and regulations for the governance of Tribal Law Enforcement and used by each agency's its personnel;
- (c) Prescribe penalties for violations of its rules and regulations;

- (d) Formation of a system to receive, review and monitor public complaints and concerns an Internal Review Board to conduct investigations and hearings on allegations of regarding law enforcement to ensure law enforcement is meeting the needs of the communitymisconduct;
- Hear final appeals from Law Enforcement Officers for discipline imposed by their respective Law Enforcement Program Manager, Chief of Police or the Internal Review Board;
- (f) Review <u>and make recommendations for the annual budgets prepared by Law Enforcement Program Managers and the Chief of Police providing advocacy and support for budgets and make recommendations to the Principal Chief and Tribal Council;</u>
- (g) Review and make recommendations for the qualifications for each rank and grade in the law enforcement field and make recommendations as necessary to ensure consistency within tribal agencies;
- (h) Review and make recommendations for the purchase and use of effective and use of necessary all property and equipment used by or in connection with the operation of law enforcement departments/programs;
- (i) Monitor complaints made to all law enforcement agencies for officer misconduct to ensure Advise the Chief of Police and other Tribal Law Enforcement Managers have responded to and taken appropriate action consistent with policy on law enforcement ethics and misconduct. law enforcement-And, provideproviding an annual report to the Chief and Tribal Council on this.on the number and nature of complaints and responses community relations;
- (j) Submit an annual report to the Principal Chief and Tribal Council <u>containing</u> <u>quantitative</u> and <u>qualitative</u> (performance) <u>measures</u> that illustrate how <u>much and</u> <u>what type of crimes are being reported, investigated, and charged in tribal, federal, and state courts and how efficiently law enforcement is contributing to the justice system;</u>
- (k) All Commissioners shall have the authority to vote on issues coming before the Commission;
- (I) To draft, and approve and implement protocols for the administration of duties placed uponadminister by laws of the Cherokee Police Commission;
- (m) To share relevant information/perspectives from other community groups, organizations and/or constituencies with the Commission;
